FROM THE PASTOR "THE SEED OF JOY"

In the heart of fear and pain, God plants the seed of our joy.

Lent can be a somber season of the church year. It begins with an ashen sign of mortality and sin. Bright colors turn to deep purples, alleluias fall silent, and worshipers ponder what to give up this year. Though the word Lent derives from an Old English word for *springtime*, spring still seems far off in much of the Northern Hemisphere. Easter, on the other hand, is obviously joyful. Bells ring, alleluias echo, white and gold shine brightly, and every single candle is lit. Jesus is risen, and so are the daffodils, hyacinths, and lilies. Joy clearly belongs to Easter.

Why reflect on joy during the quiet introspection of Lent instead of waiting for Easter? That seems positively un-Lenty. However! Move beyond surface assumptions and something beautiful emerges, richer and more nuanced than sheer happiness. A joyful Lent is not an oxymoron. As it turns out, joy is right at home during a minor-key season like Lent – and if joy is there, perhaps there are other seasons of life that joy calls home, too. Joy is a beacon that points us toward God's unfailing presence, even in the heart of fear and pain.

What is joy, anyway? We probably know it when we find it, but maybe we've missed some of its subtleties. Sometimes it's an emotion, sometimes a conviction, sometimes a practice; sometimes it seems far off, simply a promise. Joy can shout or it can hum quietly. It reveals itself in layers, adapting to different life circumstances. It even mixes with other experiences, like hope, sorrow, confusion, peace, or pain. The complexity of joy reflects the complexity and beauty of God.

One of the ways we will hear about joy is through the scripture readings on Sunday during worship. This year we will hear all about the covenants that God makes with God's people throughout history, and those covenants are --- well, joyful. God promises Noah and all earthly creatures that God will never again send a flood! God promises Abram and Sarai a child! God shapes a way of life for the Israelites to replace the system of oppression that kept them captive! Over and over throughout this season, scripture points us toward the deep joy with which God responds to creation, and it invites us to respond to God in turn.

And something new this year, we are replacing our evening worships with a daytime opportunity to gather! Beginning on Thursday, February 22nd, Ascension hosts each week a Soup Luncheon and Worship, from 12-1:00 pm. in the Assembly Room. "Enduring Joy" offers the opportunity to explore varied prayer practices, (many of which are also recommended in Tending Joy devotional guide for individual use at home that we have available at the church). Lent and Easter

The Ascension community gathers for special worship services on Ash Wednesday, every Thursday noontime during Lent, and during Holy Week.

LENT

Lent is the 40-day period of repentance and renewal preceding Easter. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the Easter service. Lent is a special time for confession and prayer, a time to renew and strengthen our faith as we reflect on Jesus' journey to the cross and victory over death.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lent season. We receive with ashes the sign of the cross on our foreheads and intentionally enter into Lent, the season of repentance and renewal.

Ashes-to-Go - "Ashes to Go" is about bringing spirit, belief, and belonging out from behind the church doors. It's a simple event with deep meaning, drawing on centuries of tradition and worship to provide a contemporary moment of grace. Ascension offers this as a drive-up opportunity on the service road, outside the front doors.

Ash Wednesday Worship - Marking our foreheads with dust, we acknowledge that we die and return to the earth. At the same time, the dust traces the life-giving cross indelibly marked on our foreheads at baptism. While we journey through Lent to return to God, we have already been made one with God through Christ. This reflective evening worship includes an extended time of confession, reading of scripture, holy communion, and receiving of ashes.

HOLY WEEK

Holy Week is the time we remember Jesus' last week on earth, beginning with Jesus' entry to Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and ending with Jesus' resurrection on Easter. This is the heart of Lent, the time of Jesus' movement to the cross where he showed his love is stronger than death. And finally, after 40 days, we rejoice in the glorious new dawn of Easter. Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Palm/Passion Sunday - On Palm/Passion Sunday we remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, the city where five days later he was crucified. People lined the way, waving palm branches and shouting, "Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord!" Oftentimes, to grasp the fullness of something significant, we have to look at both sides. So it is that to approach the meaning of Christ, we have to say two things: Jesus and Christ; human and divine; dead and alive; bread and body. This Sunday celebrates these two sides: we begin by praising Christ with "Hosanna," and we go on to shout "Crucify him!" Come to join us as we fit both truths into one service. The service begins outside (weather permitting), followed by a palm processional into the sanctuary, and the reading of the Passion story.

Maundy Thursday

On Maundy Thursday we remember Jesus' last meal with his disciples. At this meal, Jesus washed the feet of his dearest friends to show them that the life of his followers was one of humble service. Then he shared bread and wine, telling them this was his body and blood, given for forgiveness of sins. Good Friday On Good Friday we remember the day that Jesus was arrested, condemned to death, and died on the cross. We gather at the foot of the cross to wonder at the depth of Jesus' love!

EASTER DAY

On Easter Day we celebrate the risen Jesus! Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia! The entire congregation comes together to celebrate all the glory of Easter with flowers, trumpets, choir music, and lots of "alleluias" to show the joy we feel in our hearts!

CHRISTMAS GREETINGS from ANDRIS and MARY JANE in HAITI

Have a very special Christmas with your loved ones, family, and friends celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.







We are thankful for all of our Lord's blessings and protection over us, the children, our staff, and our neighbors in Haiti. We continue to trust and know that God is the only one capable of changing hearts and lives here in Haiti and abroad. We believe that God will one day in His divine timing intervene and bring change to this nation of Haiti. Therefore, we continue to pray, work, and minister as the Lord permits. When I (Mary Jane) first came to Haiti in 1986, the Lord impressed on me that my security is in Him and Him alone. True safety is in the presence of Christ and His will for our lives. One thing about Haiti – it often keeps you praying and trusting in Christ. We must always remember that nothing happens to us without God's approval.

The Church is going; we have seen a slight increase in the number of adults and young adults attending the services and Bible studies. Andris continues to teach about our personal relationship with Christ and then our families and others, and that we need to grow and mature spiritually. Baptism classes are going well; we have 7 people. We are hoping to have the baptisms in late Dec. or early Jan. The women's group learned basic first aid, and each received a basic homemade kit. We continue to study the women of the Bible.

The primary school and preschool are going well. We remain open, and the staff and students come. Christian education is essential to change the mindset and situation in Haiti. We continue to work toward preparing and enabling each new generation so that one day, Haiti will be as it should be. We are trying to instill an inner peace in our students and staff through God's word and truth.

Trade school, including music classes, is also open and progressing. We run shorter, intense classes with the students since many have to pass through local gang areas. We received the final results of the government trade school licensure exams from last year. 100 % of business, cooking, and men's sewing students passed. 80 % of the women's sewing students passed. THAT IS EXCELLENT, IN SPITE OF THE UNREST IN THE COUNTRY AND OUR LOCALITY.

Everyone is really tired of the unrest, gang activity, lockdowns, and violence here in Haiti. Those not involved with the political unrest or gangs want schools to be able to function well and the country to function with a measure of safety and security for all students and people.

It has been another intense and difficult year in Haiti, but God is sovereign in the midst of it all. God continues to watch over and keep the Haitian people in spite of these big obstacles. It has been over 2 years since we have been able to go to town or Port-au-Prince. I (Mary Jane) definitely miss doing the shopping for groceries and mission supplies. Thankfully, some of our staff is willing to do local purchasing for us when the streets are safe.

We continue to do maintenance, and have accomplished many tasks. We started the process of cleaning, painting, and re-organizing the guesthouse. However, paint supplies are now difficult to receive due to the DR (Dominican Republic) border closing. Every year, we work on revising and updating each of the curriculums for the trade school classes. The new textbooks for the cooking school are finished and in use. Our big problem now is getting ink, toner, and paper to do copies for the students. We have been cleaning up the school yard, putting some cement down for walkways (instead of using the muddy areas). We continue to train and enable the Haitian staff to do more and more of the mission work and business. We do a lot of small jobs that we never had time to do. We are patiently waiting for the local area to open and allow vehicles in and out to begin the 1st part of the bridging-the-community project.

Our 3 nursing students were able to come for a short stay this summer. Ludrenne is in her 3rd yr. now, while Loveline and Mayderlline are in their 4th and final year. They each have changed a lot and are happy to be advancing in their studies. Our other girls are all doing well: Joos is in the 10th grade, Neissa and Valerie are in the 11th grade, Darla is in the 4th grade. These girls spend lots of time with us and consider us Mom and Papa, they also love to talk to Mary Jane's Mom: they call her grandma.

It is our vision to challenge each and every person to grow in an active and deeper relationship with Jesus Christ and for there to be unity in the relationships one with another. Our goal is to give everyone the possibility to receive an excellent education – to advance and develop a hope and a vision for tomorrow.





'I beg you, bear with one another in love'

The Christian Women of Palestine are calling us to connect with the land from where Jesus came; where he was born, ministered and died – and from where our faith began and is rooted. Despite living in an area of the world where there is ongoing conflict and the future is uncertain, the women of Palestine are sharing with love a reminder that they are there, and they want to give hope to everyone. The theme of the service 2024 'bear with one another in love' seems very appropriate for these women who will not give up witnessing the love of Jesus Christ.

World Day of Prayer is an international, inter-church organisation led by women which enables us to hear the thoughts of those women from all parts of the world: their hopes, concerns, and prayers. The preparation for the day is vast. An international committee is based in New York and there are national committees in each participating country. Regional conferences meet to consider the service and then local groups make their plans. Finally, at a church near you on Friday 1 March 2024 people will gather to celebrate the service prepared by the women of Palestine.

The Day of Prayer is celebrated in over 146 countries. It begins in Samoa and prayer in native languages travels throughout the world - through Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Europe and the Americas before finishing in American Samoa some 38 hours later.


