





Music Notes: Today, we continue the "Seed of Joy" theme in our introit and in the anthem, by long-time Columbus lyricist/composer couple, Mary Kay Beall, and John Carter, foreshadowing our rapidly-approaching Holy Week and reminding us of Christ as the principal "Seed of Joy" — dying, only to sprout again in His resurrection. The offertory melody is by Lutheran composer, Johann Crüger; lyrics (see ELW #349) are by Lutheran preacher and poet, Johann Heermann, and are thought to reflect Herrmann's actual suffering, mostly during the 30-Years War. The prelude is likewise an anticipation of Jesus' setting his face toward Jerusalem, and the postlude an original forethought of the triumphal entry. The organ selection to end communion is one of the best known of Irish hymns—apropos the day! ~Ed

Today's Commemoration

Patrick, bishop, missionary to Ireland, died 461 Sunday, March 17, 2024

A native of Britain, Patrick was kidnapped by pirates at age sixteen and sold into slavery in Ireland. After a few years, he escaped, returned home, and entered the ministry. Returning to Ireland, he successfully served as a bishop and missionary there.
